JOB PURPOSE

The Project Manager will be responsible for the planning, delivery and evaluation of a new extra-curricular school-based project supporting children and young people with additional support and/or complex healthcare needs. The project will involve planning fun and creative sport and non-sports activities, food provision (prepared externally) and transport home where required. The successful applicant **must** excel in supporting children and young people with additional support needs and have a passion for improving the lives of people in Dundee.

KEY TASKS AND EXPECTATIONS

- Ensure all sessions are safe and comply with all relevant NGB, insurance and DUCT policies and requirements.
- Support in the promotion of all activities by submitting suitable photographs for each session.
- Liaise with parents, guardians and partners and keep all stakeholders up to date at all times.
- Ensure the project is delivered under budget.
- Co-ordinate transport from the session/school home.
- Lead in supporting the whole family by truly understanding the needs of each individual
- Completion of any other reasonable duties as directed by senior staff.

- Ensure that risk assessments are up to date and, attendance registers are completed for each session and issues are escalated.
- Take responsibility for selfdevelopment and be open to constructive feedback.
- Support sessional staff and volunteers to deliver the highest standard of sessions.
- Co-ordinate the delivery of food as part of the project.
- Provide weekly written updates on the progress of the project.
- Plan activity that continues into the school holidays and supports families year round.
